The Interdisciplinary Studies B.A. degree program is designed to match your academic and entrepreneurial talent to new or emerging job categories, which will increasingly require those with unique, multi-dimensional skill sets. The degree draws upon courses within the College of Arts, Sciences & Education as well as selected other FIU schools and colleges. Its course of study gives students broad latitude in self-designing their degree focus. It is possible to complete this program fully online.

The Interdisciplinary Studies B.A. major is available to those in FIU's Honors College; Honors College students fulfill several of the degree's area requirements through the specialized, interdisciplinary seminars taught by Honors College faculty.
