

B.S. in Early Childhood Education: Early Childhood Development Online

Program Description

The Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Development Track focuses on understanding of learning and development during the early childhood years. Students will learn about the cognitive, language, and social/emotional development of young children within the context of family and community studies. Students will also learn about general and early education practices and curricula. (NOTE: This track does not result in teacher certification.)

Admission Requirements & Application

1. A minimum lower-division GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale
2. Successful completion of 60 credit hours of lower-division coursework or an AA degree from a Florida public institution
3. University Core Curriculum/General Education must be complete
