Program Description

The Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Education with ESOL Endorsement is an initial teacher preparation program designed to train future teachers of students from PreK-3rd. The program is designed to provide students with general knowledge of teaching and pedagogical practices, as well as specific knowledge relevant to working in the early childhood education field.

Admission Requirements & Application

- A minimum lower-division GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale
- Successful completion of 60 credit hours of lower-division coursework or an AA degree from an accredited institution
- A passing score on all sections of the General Knowledge Exam (GK). *All students must pass the GK exam and be admitted to their program by the end of the semester they successfully complete 72 credit hours*
- University Core Curriculum/General Education must be completed
- Major Pre-requisites (listed below) must be taken and passed with a minimum grade of C

Student Teaching

All courses must be completed prior the start of student teaching and both the FTCE: Professional Exam and FTCE: Subject Area Exam must be taken, passed, and official scores received by FIU three weeks prior to student teaching. Students must be FULLY admitted to their program to apply for student teaching. Student may apply for student teaching in the Office of Field Experiences by February 1st for the Fall semester student teaching and June 1st for Spring semester student teaching.

Graduation Requirements

- 1) FIU cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale
- 2) University Foreign Language Requirement (FLENT/FLEX) must be met
- 3) University Summer Enrollment Requirement must be met
- 4) Global Learning Requirement must be met
- 5) All program and University requirements must be met
