B.S. in Elementary Education: Career Development Track Fall 2025

Program Description

The Elementary Education: Career Development Major prepares students for careers that draw on educational expertise but do not require teacher certification. It is well suited for roles in government, nonprofit organizations, educational policy, curriculum development, business, or private schools—settings where knowledge of child development and educational systems is valuable. While focused on elementary education (grades K–6), this major does not lead to certification. It includes field school placements and a practicum to support broad professional development and enhance students' professional preparation.

(NOTE: This track does not result in teacher certification.)

- Successful completion of 60 credit hours of lower-division coursework or an AA degree from an accredited institution
