Program Description

The English major empowers students by teaching them to read critically, think creatively, write clearly and express themselves effectively. The Linguistics track prepares students to engage with the linguistic diversity of our increasingly globalized world. Miami-Dade County is home to over 2 million people who speak a language other than or in addition to English. This track offers an exciting array of courses in language structure and variation; monolingual, bilingual, and L2 development and processing; language universals, linguistic analysis, and sociolinguistics. The track helps prepare students for careers related to language or language teaching, or for graduate work in Linguistics or a related discipline.

Graduation Requirements

- 1) FIU cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better on a 4.0 scale
- 2) All prerequisites and program courses must be completed with a minimum grade of "C"
- 3) Complete a minimum of 45 units of coursework at the 3000 level or higher
- 4) University Foreign Language (FLENT/FLEX), Global Learning, and Summer Enrollment requirements must be met
- 5) All program and University requirements must be met
