#### **Graduation Requirements**

- 1) FIU cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better on a 4.0 scale
- 2) All prerequisites and program courses must be completed with a minimum grade of "C"
- 3) Successful completion of 60 credit hours of lower-division coursework or an AA degree from an accredited institution
- 4) Complete a minimum of 45 units of coursework at the 3000 level or higher
- 5) University Foreign Language (FLENT/FLEX), Global Learning, and Summer Enrollment requirements must be met
- 6) All program and University requirements must be met
