Program Description

The undergraduate ESE program utilizes a field centered preparation model leading to approval for State of Florida Certification in Exceptional Student Education with ESOL Endorsement and Reading Endorsement. We offer a rigorous program that prepares teachers of students with disabilities in K-12 settings with coursework and field experiences that focus on the necessary skills to assess, plan, teach, and evaluate the education of students with high-incidence disabilities, including those who are ESOL. Students are prepared to teach learners with high-incidence disabilities from ages 5-22.

Admission Requirements & Application

- A minimum lower-division GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale.
- Successful completion of 60 credit hours of lower-division coursework or an AA degree from an accredited institution.
- A passing score on all sections of the General Knowledge Exam (GK). All students must pass the FTCE GK exam and be admitted to their program by the end of the semester they successfully complete 72 credit hours++.
- University Core Curriculum/General Education must be completed.
- Major Pre-requisites and program courses (listed below) must be taken and passed with a minimum grade of C.

Practicum and Student Teaching

<u>**Practicum</u>: The semester prior to student teaching, along with class attendance at the University, students must take EEX 4067 & EEX 4240 which requires up to 120 hours of field experience in total (20 hours per week for 6 weeks or 15 hours for 8 weeks). Offered in fall only.

<u>Student Teaching:</u> All courses must be completed prior the start of student teaching and both the FTCE: Professional Exam and FTCE: Subject Area Exam must be taken, passed, and official scores received by FIU three weeks prior to student teaching. Students must be FULLY admitted to their program in order to apply for student teaching. Student may apply for student teaching in the Office of Field Experiences in ZEB 130.

Graduation Requirements

- FIU cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale
- University Foreign Language Requirement (FLENT/FLEX) must be met
- University Summer Enrollment Requirement must be met
- Global Learning Requirement must be met
- All program and University requirements must be met
