# Biograd Funding Guide

There are a lot of funding opportunities available to Biology graduate students! Please see below for summary information and web links with details on each award.

### OVERVIEW OF AID AVAILABLE

Various forms of financial assistance are available to graduate students at FIU. Note that the summary below is not exhaustive and may change as funding streams change. The University Graduate School serves as a core resource for graduate funding information with additional support by CASE. Regular updates to the Graduate Program Policies and Procedures manual are expected to assist navigation of funding opportunities.

# GRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIP LINES

Assistantship lines are issued to full-time students by the Department of Biological Sciences. The program manages Research assistantships (RA), Graduate Assistantships (GA) and Teaching assistantships (TA). RA and GA lines are supported on an individual basis by grant monies that the major professors have secured for their labs, and are issued specifically per the discretion and authorization of the major professor. TA lines are issued to the program by CASE on an annual basis. Both Master's and Doctoral students are eligible for RA and GA lines, whereas only Doctoral students are eligible for TA lines.

Graduate assistantships are renewed each term. An assistantship can be renewed for up to two years for M.S. students or four years for PhD students. Satisfactory progress toward the degree and a 3.0 GPA are required for renewal. TA lines are currently capped at a maximum of 5 years duration per person, extended only in extraordinary situations. Please note that acceptance of an assistantship is formalized by signing a contract with the university that requires students to decline and/all outside employment. # SELF-SUPPORT

Any student who is holding employment outside the graduate program is considered to be a self-supported student. Self-support also includes cases where students have accepted loans and/or need-based grants as a support basis for participating in the graduate program. # FELLOWSHIP AWARDS

Fellowships are awarded to graduate students by various entities outside the Department. Institutional fellowships are awarded by CASE as well as UGS. External fellowships are issued by sources outside of the university. These awards are for MS and/or PhD students, as specified by the fellowship announcement. PhD students who were admitted with a TA allocation in place, that has not yet been fully utilized at the time of a fellowship being awarded, are allowed to defer use of the TA line. The Graduate Program Office also advises students to request "POI access" from HR if switching over from an assistantship to a fellowship line, to ensure continuity of access to institutional resources that require an employee-based Login and Password. Summary details about fellowships and other awards available to graduate students in the Department of Biological Sciences are provided below. Master's awards are indicated by cyan highlighting, and dissertation completion awards are indicated by yellow highlighting.

Smithsonian Institution Fellowship Program (SIFP): open to Doctoral students who passed their proposal milestone, doing research related to Smithsonian collections/facilities/research interests. - ✤ Provost Degree Completion Fellowship: open to Doctoral students who are nearly finished with their degrees, have run out of assistantship/fellowship funding, and are facing financial circumstances that stand to disrupt continuous enrollment. This is specifically a tuition waiver award. Applications open fall/spring/summer for this award and are usually announced by email.
- Provost Employer Supported Tuition Fellowship: open to Doctoral students whose employers are paying their assistantship, or are allocating time to the degree. This is specifically a tuition waiver award. Applications open fall/spring/summer for this award and are usually announced by email.
- ✤ UGS Writing Fellows Program: open to Doctoral students who commit 2 semesters of service as writing facilitators for the grad program (October deadline).

  - BSA Impact Award: recognizes impactful work that supports a diverse community of engaged scholars, such as by affecting practices/policies, enabling access to knowledge/resources. Award is \$1000 and a plaque. Note this award is specifically by nomination (deadline: late April).
  - BSA Botanical Advocacy and Service event: open to graduate students whose work is connecting the public, and/or policy makers to the botanical sciences, inclusive of shaping public policy. Award is \$1000 (deadline early spring).
  - > Donald R. Kaplan Dissertation Award in Comparative Morphology: open to post-candidacy students who are working on plant comparative morphology. The award provides up to \$10,000 for equipment, supplies, research travel, conference travel and/or summer support (deadline early Feb).
  - Graduate Student Dissertation Award in Phylogenetic Comparative Plant Biology: supports post-candidacy students whose projects address phylogeny, trait evolution, and biotic relationships between lineages. The award provides up to \$10,000 for equipment, supplies, research travel, conference travel and/or summer support (deadline early February).
  - Graduate Student Research Award: \$1500 to support graduate student research in the botanical sciences (deadline mid-February).
- CUAHSI Let's Talk About Water grant program: provides up to \$7500 reimbursement of costs to graduate students to promote discussion of water science via film (refer to website for current deadlines). <u>https://www.cuahsi.org/lets-talk-about-water</u>

  - **FNPS Endowment Grant program**: awards up to \$2500 for research that promotes preservation, conservation, and restoration of Florida native plants.
  - **FNPS Conservation Grants**: up to \$5000 for research on preservation, conservation, or restoration of rare or imperiled native plants. Project must be sponsored by a local FNPS chapter.
  - **FNPS Dan Austin Grant for Ethnobotany**: for research on Florida native plant species/communities with a human/plant connection. Amount of award not specified.
- Sea Grant awards: awards open to graduate students are below (deadlines vary by award).

- Aylesworth Scholarship: aims to support the best and brightest graduate students who are doing marine sciences research. The award provides \$2,500 per semester, for every semester in graduate school, pending satisfactory progress to the degree (Early June deadline).
- FSG-Guy Harvey Fellowship: for graduate students who are studying sustainable management of marine fish. Award is \$5000, plus up to \$1500 toward travel and professional development after the initial award (Mid-July deadline).
- National Marine Fisheries Service & Sea Grant Joint Fellowship: open to grad students who are studying population and ecosystem dynamics and/or marine resource economics. Note the awardee works closely with a mentor from NOAA Fisheries. Award is \$5000, plus up to \$1500 toward travel and professional development after the initial award (due by January, with notification of intent to apply at least a month before the deadline).

#### NOAA Sea Grant award:

John A Knauss Policy Fellowship Program: open to graduate students whose projects involve studying ocean, coastal or great lakes, with an interest in how national policy affects those resources. The award funds a 1-year experience with Knauss "hosts" in Washington DC governmental offices. Stipend is \$45,700 (deadline is mid-April, with pre-notification of interest at least 2 weeks prior.)

- Garden Club of America: has funds open for graduate student research or travel, related to projects on botany, coastal wetlands, conservation, ecological restoration and pollinator research. Amounts range from \$3000-\$8000. - Graduate Women In Science (GWIS) National Fellowship: Awards up to \$10,000 for female graduate students carrying out hypothesis-driven research in the life sciences (deadline early- to mid-January). <u>https://www.gwis.org/page/fellowship\_apcheck</u>
- Grass Foundation Fellowships: Open to students near the end of their Doctorate, who wish to conduct 14 weeks of independent investigative work at the Marine Biology Laboratory at Woods Hole. Supported research areas include neurobiology, neurophysiology, neuroanatomy, neuropharmacology. - Hispanic Scholarship Fund: open to Hispanic graduate students (preferentially in STEM fields) pursuing their first graduate degree. Application needs FAFSA information. The awards range \$500-\$5000 (February deadline). <u>https://www.hsf.net/scholarship</u>

- International Palm Society Grant Award: Awards from \$1000-\$5000 are available to graduate students who are studying various aspects of palm biology (deadline late November). <a href="https://palms.org/resources/grants/">https://palms.org/resources/grants/</a>
- ✤ Lewis and Clark Fund for Exploration and Field Research: Awards up to \$5400 for Doctoral students to support collection of specimens and data. The budget should be used for travel and research expenses like field equipment (deadline early- to mid-November).
- Sigma Xi Grant in Aid of Research: provides up to \$5000 for graduate student Sigma Xi members, and up to \$1000 for graduate student non-members for scientific research (March deadline). https://www.sigmaxi.org/programs/grants-in-aid-of-research
- Thermo Fisher Scientific Antibody Scholarship Program: open to Master's and Doctoral students who have above 3.0 GPA (also had above 3.0 GPA as undergraduates). Awards run \$5000-\$10,000. - Graduate and Professional Student Committee (GPSC) travel funds: amount available per student varies, depending upon travel details and destination. - ✤ Judith Evans Parker Travel Scholarships: awards up to \$1,000 for international research in ecology/ environmental biology and management. Note the call for applications is usually issued by email each year (deadline is middle to end of March).
- Kelly Foundation Tropical Botany Scholarship: Covers travel and/or meeting expenses for students working on tropical plant science. Maximum amount \$500 (March deadline). <u>https://fiu.academicworks.com/</u> (search for related keywords to find the announcement)
- Tinker Field Research Collaborative Grant: capped at \$3000/applicant. Supports early-stage Doctoral students who need to conduct research in Spanish or Portuguese-speaking countries in Latin America and the Caribbean.
