Ed.D. in Adult Education and Human Resource Development

The FIU School of Education and Human Development's Ed.D. degree in Adult Education and Human Resource Development offers a cognate in Recreation and Sport Management. The program focuses on philosophical and social foundations, issues and trends, assessment, documentation, evaluation, program planning, leisure services, and sport management. This program fits well for someone who has earned a master's degree in sport and recreation management with or without a thesis. Admissions decisions are determined by the College of Arts, Sciences & Education.

Degree Overview

The Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) degree program in Adult Education and Human Resource Development (AE/HRD) is designed to serve the advanced graduate study needs of professionals by preparing them to develop, facilitate, and manage programs for a wide range of adults in arenas such as hospitality, post-secondary public and private education, business and industry, the military and other government agencies, and health care. Instructional technology management, the professoriate, performance and HRD consulting, workforce development administration, hospital administration, and knowledge management are some of the career arenas open to graduates.

Program Requirement

The total credit hour minimum is 96 hours beyond the bachelor's degree. Program components are:

Research Core	15 hours minimum
Cognate in Recreation and Sport Management	9 hours minimum; 18 hours recommended
Dissertation Hours	15 hours minimum

Admission Requirement

- Applicants should have a master's degree and an undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale in upper-division coursework.
- GRE is required
- Letters of recommendation (3)
- Resume
- Letter of intent
- English proficiency test is required for all foreign graduates (550 paper-based, 80 internet-based on TOEFL or 6.5 on IELTS)
