Current overall GPA of 3.2 or higher.
Must have completed (and passed with a C or better) LEI 3703 prior to the application process
International graduate student applicants whose native language is not English are required to submit a score for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or for the International English Language Testing System (IELTS). A total score of 80 on the iBT TOEFL or 6.5 on the IELTS is required.
