- 4. **Create content across media.** You'll produce engaging and effective communication in various media formats, such as presentations, videos, podcasts, websites, social media content, and data visualizations.
- 5. **Engage with communities.** You'll contribute to real-world writing projects that have a positive impact on local communities. These projects may include grant proposals, flyers for local events, or community outreach campaigns.
- 6. **Communicate across cultural contexts.** You'll analyze how communication practices vary across cultures. You'll tailor your writing to engage with specific cultural communities.
