

Overview

This is an individual competition. The purpose of this competition is to promote original creative writing and illustration, to develop presentation skills and to focus on the importance of using informative/explanatory writing to increase the understanding of the reader about a certain topic.

Creating a digital, informational book will give you the opportunity to develop and learn key elements and vocabulary about a science or social studies topic and to share this information with an audience. This experience will also allow you to gain a deep understanding of the topic.

The first step is to decide what topic you would like to learn about. A list of topics is provided for you to choose from; however, you are not limited to those topics. If you are studying a topic of interest to you in science or social studies, then by all means pursue it!

The second step is to research and read about the topic, you will have a lot to write about. Suggestions for references would be 3-4 books on the topic and 3-4 websites.

The third step is to read, read the books and websites you have found on your topic. While reading write down important and interesting facts about what you are learning about your topic. From your notes, begin to organize the information in a way that you want to present it in your book. The content of your book must clearly reflect researched information that is accurate and informative.

This is an individual competition. Only two entries per chapter will be considered. Each chapter must select one or two students to represent them. Twenty-four (24) entries total will be accepted for this competition. Entries will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Twelve (12) entries will be selected for a book read aloud during a Zoom session on the day of the event.



Competition Guidelines

- A. The sponsoring teacher must submit the Online Competition Entry Form by 5:00 pm on Friday, October 30, 2020.
- B. This book should be written for a K-5 grade audience (ages 5-11).
- C. All books should be created using the <u>free</u> StoryJumper digital story telling software. Visit the <u>StoryJumper</u> website to learn <u>how to create a free StoryJumper book</u>.
- D. The written part of each page should be a paragraph.
- E. The book must include the following parts:
 - 1. A front cover page containing the title, author and illustrator.
 - 2. A dedication page (optional)
 - 3. A glossary page
 - A reference list (on a separate page) of the books/websites you used to create your book. A minimum of four references are required.
 - 5. A paragraph about yourself ("Author Bio") on a separate page.
 - 6. A back cover page.
- F. The book must include 12 pages front only or six pages front/back (excluding the pages mentioned above in bullets 1-6).
- G. Every page must have text and digital illustrations. There should be a minimum

- of 12 illustrations in the book and must clearly match the written content of the page. All digital illustrations must have labels and/or captions.
- H. The story (script) and multimedia elements (illustrations, sound clips, and videos) used for the digital book should be original work and not copied from any books or from the Internet. Digital books prepared with original pictures taken by contestants' digital camera are accepted.
- I. No copyright materials (images, digital illustrations, audio, video, characters, etc.) should be used in this book. If photos of students are used, contestants must have written parental permission as these books may be shared online.
- J. All books must reflect work from the 2020-2021 school year. Books that may have been created or submitted in previous years are ineligible.
- K. The contestant must submit the link to access the digital book by 5:00 pm on Friday, November 6, 2020 via email to feaconference@fiu.edu. The contestant's full name and the name of this competition must appear in the email subject line. Links received after this deadline will not be considered.
- L. Use this link to see instructions on <u>how to</u> <u>generate a link to share</u> your digital book.

Judging and Scoring

- A. The judges' decision is final.
- B. Contestants agree to be bound by the FEA General Competition Rules and Code of Ethics for Virtual Events and the decisions of the judges.
- C. The entry will be scored using the Writing Creation Non-Fiction Competition rubric.

How to Enter

- A. This is an individual competition. Books can only be authored by one contestant.
- B. The sponsoring teacher must complete and submit the Online Competition Entry Form.
- C. A link to access the form will be emailed to the sponsoring teacher after a group has been created on the Eventbrite registration site and the chapter sponsoring teacher has registered to attend the event.
- D. Entries submitted by email will not be accepted.
