

GENERAL COMPETITION GUIDELINES

- Participation in the competitive events at the FEA Regional Conference at FIU is by invitation only.
- All entries for individual and/or chapter competitions must be submitted by the chapter's sponsoring teacher via the Online Competition Entry Form by 5:00 pm, November 1, 2024. Entries submitted by email will not be accepted.
- All competitors must be registered to attend the conference on the Eventbrite registration site. Competitors who are not registered on Eventbrite will be disqualified.
- Individual competitions are open to high school FEA members.
- Chapter competitions are open to high school FEA chapters.
- Each high school FEA member may enter one competitive event only, either an individual or a chapter event.
- The number of entries allowed per school varies by competition.

- FEA sponsoring teachers may enter one team for each of the chapter events. The number of entrants is capped for both the individual and chapter events.
- All submitted materials must be original work from the 2024–2025 school year. Previously created or submitted materials are ineligible.
- Some competitions may require the submission of materials before the conference. All required materials must be submitted by 5:00 pm, Friday, November 8, 2024. Failure to meet the deadline will result in disqualification.
- Competitors may use AV
 materials if allowed. Relevant
 files and resources should be
 brought to the competition site on
 a USB drive, including
 downloaded Prezi files. Internet
 access will not be available.
 Competitors should bring their
 own pointing device if needed.
- Competitors must report to their assigned competition room on

time. Failure to do so can result in disqualification.

- Competitors must dress in business-casual attire. Points will be deducted for failure to adhere to the dress code. Refer to the section "Competition Dress Code" for details.
- Spectators may not coach or offer any assistance to competitors during their judging time. A breach of this guideline may result in the disqualification of the competitor.
- Recording competitions is prohibited without prior consent from competitors and judges.
- Sponsoring teachers and chaperones may not approach judges about scoring or feedback. Concerns should be directed to an FEA Regional Conference at FIU staff member.
- Certificates of participation will be awarded to all individual competitors and participating schools in chapter competitions.
 Awards will be presented to the

- top three entries in individual categories and the top two entries in chapter categories.
- All judges' decisions are final.

Competition Dress Code

- Slacks, Pants, and Suit Pants
 Acceptable items include
 Dockers-style pants, wool pants, flannel pants, dressy capris, and dress synthetic pants.
 Inappropriate items include jeans, sweatpants, exercise pants, shorts, leggings, and spandex/form-fitting pants.
- Skirts, Dresses, and Skirted
 Suits Acceptable items include
 casual dresses and skirts split at
 or below the knee. Inappropriate
 items include miniskirts, skorts,
 sundresses, beach dresses, and
 spaghetti-strap dresses.
- Shirts, Tops, Blouses, and Jackets Acceptable items include casual shirts, dress shirts, sweaters, tops, and polo shirts. FEA Chapter polo shirts are encouraged. Inappropriate items include tank tops, midriff

tops, shirts with offensive words or logos, halter tops, tops with bare shoulders, sweatshirts, and t-shirts unless worn under another blouse, shirt, jacket, or dress.

- Shoes and Footwear
 - Acceptable items include conservative athletic or walking shoes, loafers, clogs, sneakers, boots, flats, and leather decktype shoes. Inappropriate items include high-heeled shoes, flashy athletic shoes, flip-flops, and slippers.
- Hats and Head-Covering Hats are not appropriate inside the building. Head covers required for religious purposes or to honor cultural traditions are allowed.

Citations, References, and Copyrighted Material

- All ideas, text, images, and sound from other sources must be cited in competition submissions.
- Competitors are strongly discouraged from using

- copyrighted material. If used, written permission must be obtained and included with the entry submission. This includes graphics from the web and other media materials but does not apply to artifacts collected for a project.
- Plagiarism is strictly prohibited.
 Judges may disqualify students from competing if any part of their documents is plagiarized.

Electronic Devices

- Recording devices are not allowed in competitive events without special approval from the event coordinator and the competitor.
- All electronic devices—including cell phones, tablets, electronic readers, smart watches, etc. must be turned off unless otherwise specified in specific event regulations.
- No electronic communication devices are permitted during competition.
