

Florida International University Undergraduate Behavior Analysis Track and Verified Course Sequence

The Department of Psychology offers a Verified Course Sequence (VCS) that meets the course content requirements of the Behavior Analyst Certification Board © (BACB) **6th Edition Task List**. The courses listed below are open to all students, regardless of major or degree-seeking status. Online and on campus courses may be combined. *Students who intend to become a Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analysts are urged to read eligibility requirements and certification process, which are detailed in the [BACB BCaBA Handbook](#). Psychology majors who wish to have Applied Behavior Analysis noted as an area of specialization on their transcript should contact their academic advisor to add the [ABA Track](#) to their degree.*

- EAB 3002 Introduction to the Experimental Analysis of Behavior (3 credits)
Prerequisites: PSY 2012
Note: May not be taken concurrently with any other VCS course. Does not meet the 6th Edition Task List standards if taken prior to fall 2024.
- EAB 3794 Principles of Applied Behavior Analysis (3 credits)
Prerequisite: EAB 3002
Note: Does not meet the 6th Edition Task List standards if taken prior to spring 2025.
- EAB 4782 Ethics in Applied Behavior Analysis (3 credits)
Prerequisite: EAB 3002
Note: Does not meet the 6th Edition Task List standards if taken prior to spring 2025.
- EAB 4764 Advanced Principles of Applied Behavior Analysis (3 credits)
Prerequisite: EAB 3794 and EAB 4782
Note: Does not meet the 6th Edition Task List standards if taken prior to summer 2025.
- EAB 4798 Single Case Research Methods (3 credits)
Prerequisite: EAB 3002
Note: Does not meet the 6th Edition Task List standards if taken prior to summer 2025.
- EAB 4741 Supervision in Applied Behavior Analysis (3 credits)
Prerequisites: EAB 4798 and must be enrolled in ABA track
Note: Does not meet the 6th Edition Task List standards if taken prior to fall 2025
- EAB 4795 Senior Seminar in Applied Behavior Analysis (3 credits, not part of VCS, required for completion of the track)
Prerequisite: PSY 3213 or PSY 3215, AND EAB 4764
Note: This will provide exam and career preparation for those seeking certification as a BCaBA. PSY 3213 and/or PSY 3215 may be waived, at the discretion of the instructor, for non-psychology majors and non-degree-seeking students ONLY. Prerequisites may not be waived for degree-seeking psychology majors.

No Course Substitutions Are Allowed

RECOMMENDED SCHEDULES: All courses are usually offered every semester on campus and online. The VCS can be completed in four semesters if the courses are taken in the manner shown in Option 1 below.
