The Department of Psychology offers a Verified Course Sequence (VCS) that meets the course content requirements of the Behavior Analyst Certification Board © (BACB) **6th Edition Task List**. The courses listed below are open to all students, regardless of major or degree-seeking status. Online and on campus courses may be combined. *Students who intend to become a Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analysts are urged to read eligibility requirements and certification process, which are detailed in the <u>BACB BCaBA Handbook</u>. Psychology majors who wish to have Applied Behavior Analysis noted as an area of specialization on their transcript should contact their academic advisor to add the <u>ABA Track</u> to their degree.*

EAB 3002 Introduction to the Experimental Analysis of Behavior (3 credits)

Prerequisites: PSY 2012

Note: May not be taken concurrently with any other VCS course. Does not meet the 6th Edition Task List

standards if taken prior to fall 2024.

EAB 3794 Principles of Applied Behavior Analysis (3 credits)

Prerequisite: EAB 3002

Note: Does not meet the 6th Edition Task List standards if taken prior to spring 2025.

May be taken before or concurrently with EAB 4782, but not after.

EAB 4782 Ethics in Applied Behavior Analysis (3 credits)

Prerequisite: EAB3002

Note: Does not meet the 6th Edition Task List standards if taken prior to spring 2025.

May be taken before or concurrently with EAB 3794, but not after.

EAB 4764 Advanced Principles of Applied Behavior Analysis (3 credits)

Prerequisite: EAB 3794 and EAB 4782

Note: Does not meet the 6th Edition Task List standards if taken prior to summer 2025.

May be taken before or concurrently with EAB 4798, but not after.

EAB 4798 Single Case Research Methods (3 credits)

Prerequisite: EAB 3002

Note: Does not meet the 6th Edition Task List standards if taken prior to summer 2025.

May be taken concurrently with EAB 4764.

EAB4714 Supervision in Applied Behavior Analysis (3 credits)

Prerequisites: Must be enrolled in ABA track and have completed EAB4798 with a B or higher

Note: Does not meet the 6th Edition Task List standards if taken prior to fall 2025

May be taken concurrently with EAB 4795

EAB 4795 Senior Seminar in Applied Behavior Analysis (3 credits, not part of VCS, required for completion of the track)

Prerequisite: PSY 3213 or PSY 3215, AND EAB 4764

Note: May be taken concurrently with EAB4714. This course is intended to serve as exam and career preparation for those seeking certification as a BCaBA.

PSY 3213 and/or PSY 3215 may be waived, <u>at the discretion of the instructor</u>, for <u>non-psychology</u> majors and <u>non-degree-seeking</u> students ONLY. <u>Prerequisites may not be waived for degree-seeking psychology majors</u>.

No Course Substitutions Are Allowed
