

## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

## 1. Question: What are the application requirements for this program?

### Answer:

- 3.0 average GPA for the last two years of the undergraduate program
- General Graduate Record Exam (GRE) scores (there is no minimum score requirement)
- Three letters of recommendation evaluating the applicant's potential for graduate work;
   applicants are strongly encouraged to provide at least one letter of recommendation from a professor or academic source
- A letter of intent, which is a brief essay stating the reasons for interest in the program and career goals
- Résumés and CVs are optional

## 2. Question: If my GPA is below a 3.0 can I still apply?

### Answer:

We encourage all students to apply. When reviewing applications, other factors including GRE scores, letters of recommendation, professional experience, and letter of intent are also reviewed thoroughly and taken into consideration

## 3. Question: Do I need to be a Psychology major to apply?

## Answer:

No. Students with backgrounds in a variety of disciplines are welcome to apply

## 4. Question: When is the application deadline?

### Answer:

June 1st

## 5. Question: When can I apply?

#### Answer:

Applications are accepted year-round, but new students are only accepted for Fall admission

## 6. Question: When will I know if I have been accepted?

### Answer:

Within approximately one month of the application deadline or July 1st

## 7. Question: How long does it take to complete this program?

#### Answer:

Four consecutive semesters;

Fall Spring Summer C Fall

## 8. Question: Can I complete this degree online or take weekend classes?

#### Answer:

- No. All of our courses, except for two, take place on the MMC on weekdays
- During the final semester of the program, students will complete an online course and an independent study/internship course

## 9. Question: Does this program include an internship?

#### Answer:

Yes. During the last semester of the program, students are enrolled in a 6-credit independent study course that will incorporate an internship experience

## 10. <u>Question:</u> What is the difference between the Organizational Science Program and other Human Resource Management programs?

#### Answer:

Our program prepares students to tackle the challenges of a changing workplace, foster employee engagement, explore what shapes organizational strategy, and analyze how data drives business decisions *from a psychology and science-based perspective* 

## 11. Question: Can I get a tuition waiver for this program?

### Answer:

Yes. Full-time, benefits-earning FIU employees are eligible for a tuition waiver for up to 6 credits per semester

## 12. Question: Does this program offer assistantships/fellowships?

#### Answer:

No, this program does not offer assistantships or fellowships

## 13. Question: What financial aid options are available?

### Answer:

Students are encouraged to seek financial aid in the form of loans and/or external scholarships

# 14. <u>Question:</u> If I have already started graduate school, can I transfer credits to this program?
